Ukrainian Humanitarian Aid

Evacuation to the West & Supply Transport to the East

During the first days of Russia's invasion into Ukraine, Andriy sent his wife and children to live with close family friends in the West, while he drove close friends to other areas in the West. Andriy loaded his vehicle with food, medicine and supplies and headed back East to his church's base camp, approximately 2 hours West of Kyiv. Over the next 6 weeks, he would make dozens of journeys to pick up Kyiv residents stranded in the city, bring them to the church's base camp, take individuals and families to shelters in the West, then bring supplies back to the East again. He also made several very dangerous trips with a team of 4-5 men to extreme Eastern Ukraine to take food and assist in evacuations. Andriy was exhausted (both physically and emotionally) after these long trips, but he kept going!



Targeted Supply Shipments



After 4-6 weeks, evacuations were underway and major supply chains of food and medicine were finally being delivered by large humanitarian agencies to the large cities. Andriy then began targeting humanitarian aid to small villages. He took food, supplies, fuel, and sometimes generators to repair what Russian forces had destroyed.

Villages were in need of fuel to operate their tractors to farm so they could eat and sell crops to the rest of Ukraine.

Andriy has also delivered his FoodBox Project supplies to multiple families during these last several months, keeping many desolate families from

starving. He often encounters a family with a medically- fragile member and will go out of his way to find the medicine they need and use his own funds to help them pay for it. In June, Andriy carried military supplies including vests and food to extreme Eastern Ukraine to help the troops stay alive.



Going Forward



Andriy sees many people with enormous needs and he wants to help as many as possible. He has been working to help several families rebuild their homes that were destroyed. He knows winter will be coming and heating fuel will be too expensive for most people. He knows of 200 families currently in need, but he wants to try and supply firewood to at least 20 of these families, if possible. Andriy has successfully provided firewood for widows over the past several years and plans to use his contacts and expertise to acquire, split and deliver this firewood. Andriy also has a vision to build a greenhouse so that villagers can grow food longer this fall and maybe grow into the winter.
